## Reason for Change

Information on breast screening in Wales relates to the annual national reporting of breast screening activity and also outcome data following any uptakes of invitations for screening. This information is published annually in the Breast Test Wales annual statistical reports.

The central collection of information on breast screening has historically been provided through Korner returns KC62 and KC63; beginning in 1988-89 through the KC62 proforma and since 1994-95 through the KC63 proforma.

In recent years, there has been a change in the collection of this information, so that the information that was previously collected via the KC62 and KC63 proformas is now extracted directly from various administrative and clinical systems. It is collated, processed and aggregated on a central server at Public Health Wales (PHW) prior to its publication on the Breast Test Wales (BTW) website. Therefore, although the original 'KC' proformas have been retired, similar information is still collected through alternative means.

The NHS Wales Data Dictionary currently contains a list of terms and definitions associated with the now redundant KC62 and KC63 proformas. The definitions associated with the current arrangements for the collection of this information are available elsewhere, such as on the BTW statistical release. All references to the KC62 and KC63 returns themselves, and associated definitions, are therefore being removed from the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

A further DSCN will be issued to describe the current reporting arrangements for the collection of information on breast screening.

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## **Description of Change**

To remove references to KC62 and KC63 and associated definitions from the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

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## **Data Dictionary Version**

Where applicable, this DDCN reflects changes introduced by DDCN and/or DSCN since the release of version 4.1 of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

The changes introduced by such DDCNs will be published in version 4.2 of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

The Department, NHS Breast Screening Programme (NHSBSP), and Regional Offices require information from Local Health Boards on the breast cancer screening status of their residents.

The information is used to assess performance. Information on screening is used to monitor progress towards achieving the Government's target of a reduction in the death rate in the population invited for screening.

The return must be submitted by Local Health Boards in respect of women resident in their area as at 31 March. It is completed annually and submitted by the end of October following the end of the financial year to which the return relates.

The return is made up of 2 Parts: –

Part 1:-	Cross Section Analysis of Population Coverage within period 1/4/XXXX – 31/3/XXXX
Part 2:-	Women with Open Episodes

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## Changes to Terms (A-Z)

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### **Cancers Diagnosed**

Each table within the Breast Screening Return is made up of 6 parts – this is part 3. This part of the return describes the cancers formally diagnosed in women assessed as a result of screening. Only breast cancers should be reported, as defined in the Information and Training Manual for England and Wales.

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### **Cross Section Analysis of Population Coverage within Period 1/4/xxxx – 31/3/xxxx**

KC63 requires information on the screening history of women who were resident in the Local Health Boards as at 31 March.

All types of screening episodes taking place within the stated period are counted. However, a woman will only be counted once in each screening category, regardless of how many episodes she has. An episode may be the result of an invitation for screening within the programme, or a referral for screening from outside the programme.

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## **Early Recalls**

This is table D of the Breast Screening Return which reports on women who received a non-routine/early recall advice.

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## **First Invitation for Routine Screening**

Table A of the Breast Screening Return which reports on women invited to the Screening Programme for the first time.

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## **Invitations and Outcomes**

Each table within the Breast Screening Return is made up of 6 parts – this is Part 1. This is a summary of the outcomes of screening and assessment of all women invited and/or screened.

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## **Outcome Measures**

Each table within the Breast Screening Return is made up of 6 parts – this is Part 4. This part presents a selection of outcome measures related to the NHS Breast Screening Programme (NHSBSP) quality targets.

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## **Routine Invitation to Previous Attendees (last screen more than 5 years previously)**

Table C2 of the Breast Screening Return which reports on women who are due a routine recall and the last screening date was more than 5 years.

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## **Routine Invitation to Previous Attendees (last screen within 5 years)**

Table C1 of the Breast Screening Return which reports on women who are due a routine recall and the last screening date was within 5 years

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## **Routine Invitation to Previous Non-attendees**

Table B of the Breast Screening Return which reports on women who were invited to the Breast Screening Programme but where the patient arrived late and could not be seen, or appointment cancelled by the patient or there was a did not attend with no advance warning given.

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## **Self/GP Referrals of Women Not Screened Previously**

Table E of the Breast Screening Return which reports on women who have not been tested previously, but are being referred directly for a Screening Test rather than as an invitation as part of the Screening Programme.

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## **Self/GP Referrals of Women Screened Previously (last screened more than 5 years previously)**

Table F2 of the Breast Screening Return which reports on women who have referred directly for a Screening Test more than 5 years previously

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## **Self/GP Referrals of Women Screened Previously (last screen within 5 years)**

This is table F1 of the Breast Screening Return which reports on women who have been referred directly for a Screening Test within the last 5 years.

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## **Women with Open Episodes**

This counts the number of women with open screening episodes. An open episode is incomplete; that is, results from a screening test, either through an invitation as part of the screening programme, or through a referral outside the programme are still awaited.

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## **Target Population**

That part of the population which the structured programme e.g. screening, immunisation or surveillance aimed to reach.

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## **Surveillance**

A surveillance programme is a programme delivered to individuals and directed towards the identification of a range of possible disorders which can be treated, or their adverse consequences reduced, more effectively by earlier, rather than later, intervention.

The broad objective is the general oversight of health or monitoring of development which involves assessment of a selected group of the population by means of practical and uniform observations and measurements which can be applied rapidly.

The number of stages in a District's surveillance programme will be determined locally although generally there will be not more than 5 stages of surveillance prior to school entry and not more than 4 stages while the child is of school age.
