Reason for Change

Information on uses of the Mental Health Act 1983 is published annually in the Welsh Government statistical publication 'Admission of Patients to Mental Health Facilities'.

The central collection of this information is provided through the KP90 central return, which is used to collect data annually from mental health facilities on the number of uses of the Mental Health Act 1983 Legislation and other legislation, such as admissions, changes in status and detentions under the Mental Health Act 1983.

This data collection has been running since the mid 1990s and was reviewed in 2008-09 to add in additional data items collecting data on the use of sections 135 and 136 of the Mental Health Act.

The NHS Wales Data Dictionary currently contains a list of terms and definitions associated with the KP90 proforma. The definitions associated with the current arrangements for the collection of this information are available elsewhere, such as on

the Welsh Government statistical release. All definitions and terms related to the KP90 return are therefore being removed from the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

A further DSCN will be issued to update the current reporting arrangements for the collection of this information and to also document forthcoming changes to the collection.

Psychiatric Census		

This is a classification of a patient's legal status which is either informal or as designated in the Mental Health Act 1983 or other acts. The classification "informal" is used for those patients who are not formally detained or not receiving supervised aftercare. The classification is required for all patients who have a hospital provider spell which includes the care of a Consultant in the psychiatric specialties or have been discharged from such a hospital provider spell and are required to receive supervised aftercare under the provision of the Mental Health (Patients in the Community) Act 1995.

For the APC ds99 this data item became effective from April 1999 and, with the data item Administrative Category, replaced the data item Category of Patient.

Changes to Terms (A-Z)

Psychiatric Patient

A psychiatric patient is any patient under the care of a consultant in one of the psychiatric specialties (700 - 715) i.e. mental handicap, mental illness, child and adolescent psychiatric, forensic psychiatric, psychotherapy or old age psychiatry.

Long term patient: patient who has a hospital spell of one year or more, and has spent the majority of that spell under the care of consultants in the psychiatric specialties.

Include:

a)	All psychiatric patients not covered by a contract with a NHS Local Health Board, admitted to or resident in authorised mental nursing homes, whether or not transferred from another hospital.
