Legislation that is moving forward in Europe will put strict new regulations on Big Tech, the broadest bill of this nature that has been adopted since the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) went into effect in 2018.

When law enforcement agencies want to obtain user data from big tech platforms without a court order, they can submit "emergency data requests" in cases that involve imminent risk of serious physical injury or death. This widely practice likely to face greater public scrutiny with the revelation that hackers were able to forge these data requests and make off with protected user data from Apple and Meta in mid-2021.
