Cybercriminals frequently target personal data, which can command a high price on the black market for use in scams. Information like full names and official ID numbers is especially valuable because, unlike credit card details, it typically remains unchanged over time.

The Metropolitan Police say the pair were arrested at residential addresses in Bishop's Stortford, Hertfordshire, on suspicion of computer misuse and blackmail. Hackers were said to have stolen the photographs, names and addresses of about 8,000 children from the Kido chain.
