Ascension, one of the largest private healthcare systems in the United States, has revealed that the personal and healthcare information of over 430,000 patients was exposed in a data breach disclosed last month.

The ICO have fined Newcastle based ECO4U, £50,000 for making over 194,000 unlawful marketing calls to people on the UK's 'do not call' register. The companies' unlawful calls related to grants for new boilers and solar panels, with the inference made during the calls that he was connected to a government scheme
