#### DATA SET CHANGE CONTROL PROCEDURE

#### **Summary of change:**

This DSCN advises of definitional changes to data item and terms to allow the recording and reporting of 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer activity via the Admitted Patient Care minimum dataset for Welsh Trusts. Also, it advises on how English Trusts will report on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme. This also includes guidance to the Trusts on how to report the activity within the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme through OS1. how Reference Data will be updated and who is responsible for Clinical Coding.

**Reason for Change:** To ensure 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer data is reported centrally

**Effective Date:** 1<sup>st</sup> April 2006

#### **Background:**

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme was launched by the Welsh Assembly Government on 1<sup>st</sup> April 2004. WHC (2004) 015, issued March 2004, provided policy support and listed a series of protocols under which the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme would operate.

These protocols informed how the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Commissioning Team (SOCT) would monitor the performance of the Scheme and the way in which information was to be exchanged with Welsh NHS Trusts, Local Health Boards (LHBs), Health Commission Wales and SOCT. The 2nd Offer Commissioning Team (SOCT), centrally funded and located in Rhondda Cynon Taf LHB, commissions the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer care on behalf of LHBs.

The 2nd Offer Scheme was implemented on the 1st April 2004. From that date any patient who is at risk of waiting longer than the maximum waiting time for the particular specialty, with the exception of specific exclusions, will have the opportunity of a 2nd Offer referral for treatment by an alternative provider.

The Originating Provider is the Trust holding the patient's Waiting List entry and is responsible for the patient care throughout, regardless of where the treatment takes place. This Trust's provider code is used in the patient Admitted Patient Care minimum dataset (APCmds) record submitted to the Welsh National Database by the Originating Provider.

The Receiving Provider is the Trust or Non NHS Hospital where the treatment takes place. The Receiving Provider's site code must be used as the 'Site code of treatment' along with the GMC code of the consultant who conducted the treatment in the patient record submitted to the Welsh National Database.

Two new values will be added to the data item 'Admission Method' to identify activity under the Welsh Assembly Government's 2nd Offer Scheme. These new values are:

- 14 To indicate activity under the 2nd Offer Scheme (Originating Provider)
- 15 To indicate activity under the 2nd offer Scheme (Receiving Provider)

This DSCN provides guidance on how the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme activity is reported on when it is undertaken outside the Trust organisation.

#### 1 - Recording of activity data

Activity undertaken through the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme is to be recorded on both the Originating Provider's and Receiving Provider's local systems. This will ensure that 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Activity can be identified, measured, recorded and reported accurately.

The activity will be identified using the following three data items:-

- Provider Code Will identify the provider managing the activity (Originating Provider)
- Site Code of Treatment The site code where the activity took place (Receiving Provider)
- Admission Method '14' Activity under the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme (Originating Provider)
   '15' Activity under the 2<sup>nd</sup> offer Scheme (Receiving Provider)

The GMC code of the Consultant providing the treatment within the Receiving Provider's Trust must be entered into the data item 'Consultant Code'. This will be recorded and submitted in the APCmds record sent to HSW by the Originating Provider.

Changes to the NHS Wales Data Dictionary can be found in Appendix A.

#### **Clinical Coding**

The Clinical Coding is to be completed in both the Originating Providers and the Receiving Providers Trust, with a complete copy of the record being sent to the Originating Provider for reporting to HSW. This is to ensure that a complete and accurate record is recorded on both providers' local systems and an accurate APC mds episode is returned to HSW by the Originating Provider. If the Receiving Provider is a non-NHS Organisation then the coding must be performed by the Originating Provider's coding department. This is because non-NHS hospitals do not code to (NHS) UK Clinical Coding Standards.

#### 2 - Reporting of activity data

#### **Admitted Patient Care MDS**

#### Welsh Data

# **Originating Provider**

With activity under the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme, the Originating Provider must submit to the Welsh National Database (PEDW) using Admission Method 14.

#### **Receiving Provider**

The Receiving Provider must record 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Activity on their local systems using Admission Method 15 but these records are <u>not</u> to be submitted to HSW as they will not be loaded on the NHS Wales Switching Service.

The Receiving Provider must ensure a complete copy of the record of patient care is returned to the Originating Provider. This is to ensure that a complete record is reported centrally to HSW by the Originating Provider.

# **QS1**

The facility to report 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme within the QS1 data reporting system will be enhanced to enable both the Originating Provider and Receiving Provider to report this information in a consistent way.

The <u>Originating Provider</u>, when reporting Deaths and Discharges undertaken elsewhere under by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer scheme will use the new site code (see Appendix C for example scenarios). The only field to be populated will be the Deaths and Discharges, which will show all the Trust's 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer activity outside the Trust organisation.

The <u>Receiving Provider</u>'s count of deaths and discharges as a result of 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Activity will be entered under a new column labelled '2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Deaths & Discharges'. The deaths and discharges for non 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Activity will be recorded separately under the Deaths and Discharges column. The e-Quest service will require further work for the indicators to match the QS1 modifications.

Examples of how the activity will be recorded can be found in Appendix B.

To assist with QS1 reporting, a new group of Site Codes, to be held in the Welsh Organisation Reference Data, has been assigned specifically for 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer. See Appendix C for details.

# **English Data**

Where the treatment is being conducted by an English NHS Hospital, the English Trust will record the activity using 'Admission Method' 15. This activity data will be transmitted to HSW via the NHS-Wide Clearing Service. In order to avoid duplicate records HSW will not load this activity into the National Database. The Clinical Coding will be completed at both the English and Welsh Trust sites. An example of how the reporting will take place can be found in Appendix B.

#### 3 - Management of Reference Data

#### SOCT

The Second Offer Commissioning Team will provide HSW and the Trusts with a list of the GMC codes for all consultants providing treatment under the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme and the sites where they perform 2<sup>nd</sup> offer activity.

## <u>HSW</u>

The GMC codes received from SOCT and the sites where they undertake activity will be added to the Reference Data held at HSW.

For 2<sup>nd</sup> offer activity the GMC code and the site code of treatment submitted on the APCmds record, will be validated against the HSW Reference Data

A new group of site codes has been added to the Reference Data. These codes are to be used to record 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Activity **on QS1 only**.

#### Welsh Trusts

SOCT will send the Welsh Trusts the GMC Codes of external consultants. These codes are to be entered on the Trusts' local systems to ensure accurate reporting centrally to HSW. The Trusts should start collecting 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Activity data according to this standard for central reporting as from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2006.

Additional advice concerning the 2<sup>nd</sup> Offer Scheme can be found in WHC (2004) 015 & WHC (2004) 027.

# **Provider Code**

# (APC ds99/ EAL mds/ OP mds)

This is the organisation code of the health care provider. The provider code identifies the health care provider who is responsible for managing the treatment of treats—the patient during the episode of care.

N.B. Although the healthcare provider identified in this data item is responsible for managing the patient's treatment, it may not necessarily be where the treatment is actually conducted. For example, where the treatment has been sub-contracted to another healthcare provider.

# **Admission**

# (APC ds99/ General/ KO36)

The start of the first consultant episode or nursing episode (in which the patient's GP assumes responsibility for the patient's care) of a hospital provider spell. Admission Method

# (APC ds99)

The method of admission to a hospital provider spell.

- a. **Elective admission**: where the health care provider has known about at least 24 hours in advance.
- Excludes patients transferred from another hospital provider.
- (i) Waiting list admission: patients admitted from an elective admission list when the facilities to carry out the treatment were not available and a bed could not be booked at the time.

See also **WAITING LIST SYSTEM** 

- (ii) **Booked admission**: patients admitted having been given a date for admission at the time of the consultation and the bed is booked at the same time for the patient.
  - See also **DIARY SYSTEM**
- (iii) Planned admission: patients admitted having been given a date when it was confirmed by the clinician that the patient is for medical reasons now able to receive the further planned treatment. This method is used following a first elective treatment, or an emergency treatment, if further planned elective treatment is required e.g. check cystoscopies, endoscopies, laser treatments.
- b. **Emergency admission**: patients

admitted to hospital for urgent care.

c. **Maternity admission**: an admission of a pregnant or recently pregnant woman to a maternity ward (including delivery facilities) except when the intention is to terminate pregnancy.

d. **Other**: a patient other than an elective, emergency or maternity admission admitted to a hospital bed.

# **Receiving Provider**

Caerphilly District Miners Hospital is the Receiving Provider and has performed the treatment and therefore must record the treatment but <u>not</u> report it centrally. The Clinical Coding will be completed at both Caerphilly Miners and Cardiff & Vale with a record of the patient care being sent to Cardiff & Vale to enable them to report centrally.

With the activity of the patient taking place in one of the other home countries, Velindre Hospital will report this activity centrally to HSW. The Clinical Coding will be completed at both Bristol Royal Infirmary and Velindre Hospital with a copy of the record of patient care being sent to Velindre Hospital to enable them to report centrally.

The treatment is being conducted in an English NHS Hospital, therefore, Bristol Royal Infirmary (BRI) will record an 'Admission Method' 15 and report it to Hospital Episode Statistics (HES). Thereafter, this activity data will be transmitted via the NHS-Wide Clearing Service to HSW where this data will be held for reference purposes only. To avoid duplication, these records will not be loaded into the Welsh National Database.
