Reason for Change: To ensure that there is a consistent approach to the recording and

reporting of assessment unit activity,

Implementation Date: 1st April 2009

Background:

Assessment / Clinical Decision areas enable patients to be monitored and assessed by consultant staff earlier within their pathway, rather having to be directly admitted into a hospital ward from A&E or a GP referral. It is anticipated that the earlier intervention will result in a better service to the patient and more effective clinical decision pathway.

Presently some Trusts are admitting these patients and submitting this activity to the Patient Episode Database for Wales (PEDW), whereas other Trusts are admitting these patients onto their Patient Administration Systems but are not submitting to the national database. For those Trusts who submit data to PEDW there is no way to uniquely identify this activity. Therefore there is a requirement for a level of consistency to improve the comparability of Trusts' activity which is used for benchmarking purposes.

Assessment Unit activity will be collected and submitted by all Trusts via their Admitted Patient Care (APC) extracts to Health Solutions Wales (HSW). The data will therefore be available for analysis via the PEDW. All standard reports generated from this data source will therefore be able to be analysed with or without assessment unit activity according to the report's business requirement.

Actions Required:

1. Trusts to submit their Assessment Unit Activity within the Admitted Patient Care Extract using 'Local Sub Specialty'. See Appendix B for further details.
