DATA STANDARDS CHANGE NOTICE

DATA STANDARDS CHANGE NOTICE

Introduction

Within the Information Quality Improvement (IQI) Initiative group, HDUHB requested the addition of a new value under Admission Method for Other – Hospital Transfer to GP Care. It was explained that this value is required for patients who finish their care with an acute consultant for discharge. This prompted a review of the existing values and data currently submitted under the data item. Queries were also raised with regards to whether some values needed to be retired such as Bed Bureau. A decision was made to share an Impact Assessment (IA) with Health Boards to gather feedback on the potential amendments to the Admission Method data item and to align with new terminology for Emergency Care.

Upon review of the feedback provided and consultation with WG, the changes outlined in the DSCN were agreed to be implemented. WG also requested that descriptions should be added to each value to provide clear definitions.

Description of Change

The following changes to the existing data item 'Admission Method' have been identified:

- To rename existing data item values to align with new terminology for Emergency Care.
- The implementation of 5 new data values.
- To retire 2 existing data item values.

Data Dictionary Version

Where applicable, this DSCN reflects changes introduced by DSCN and/or DDCN since the release of version 4.20 of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

The changes introduced by such DSCNs will be published in version 4.21 of the NHS Wales Data Dictionary.

<u>Actions Required</u>

Actions for Local Health Boards / Trusts:

 Update APC data extract to ensure submissions comply with the amended definitions for Admission Method

Actions for Digital Health and Care Wales:

- Update the following VASS checks:
 - o 50120: Invalid Admission Method
 - o 50611: Inconsistent Admission Method / Intended Management
 - o 50625: Inconsistent Admission Method / Patient Classification
 - o 50602: Inconsistent Admission Method / Source of Admission
- Ensure that all national systems have been updated to comply with the standard.
- Update the relevant data acquisition and warehousing processes to enable the collection, storage, onward distribution, analysis and reporting of Admission method data item to include the additional codes.
